# CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Cut your directional fabrics with fabric facing correct way up, cutting 6" strips then cross cutting into 6" squares.

#### **HERRINGBONE COT QUILT**

Please read through the pattern instructions in full before you commence sewing. 1/4" seam allowance is used throughout, unless otherwise stated. Refer to the front cover quilt image for guidance on block layout and fabric placement.

NOTE: pay attention to fabric placement when using directional prints to ensure your fabrics all face the same way.

When making half square triangles, place your pattern fabric face up and your solid fabric face down on top, so you know the pattern direction will always be correct.


NOTE: you will have a couple of spare HST blocks leftover.


#### Two at a time Half Square Triangle construction

Make your half square triangles following the instructions below: NOTE: You will need to make some blocks with the diagonal line cut in the opposite direction.


Place one pattern 6" square face up and one solid 6" square right side down on top. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. This will be your cutting line. Sew the squares a scant ¼" away along each side of the cutting line.






Cut in half diagonally along the drawn line. Open and press towards the solid coloured side. Trim your squares back to 5 ½" x 5 ½".








Take your blocks from each colourway and sew together in rows, making 10 rows of 8 blocks, following the diagram below.



Layer your quilt top, wadding and backing and glue baste together. Quilt using your preferred method.

Sew your binding strips together end to end then add binding to your trimmed quilt to finish.





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
