CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

From the texture DV2201 fabric cut:

48 6 ½ x 3 ½" rectangles

24 3 1/2" squares



From the grey check DV2935 fabric cut:

48 3 ½" squares



From the solid DV114 fabric cut:

24 3 ½" squares



From the pink DV1062 fabric cut:

48 2 ½" squares



From each of the 12 remaining patterned fabrics cut:

1 6 ½" square

8 3 ½" squares


PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Please read through the pattern instructions in full before you commence sewing. 1/4" seam allowance is used throughout, unless otherwise stated. Refer to the front cover quilt image for guidance on block layout and fabric placement.

Flying Geese Blocks Make 4 flying geese for each block

Take 1 grey texture $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and 2 patterned $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other on the reverse side of each square as shown in the diagram.










Place 1 square right sides together on top of the rectange, ensuring sides match up. Sew along the diagonal line.

Trim off excess fabric 1/4" away from sewn line.

Fold out and press.









Take the second square and place face down on top of the rectangle. Sew corner to corner along the drawn line.


Trim off excess fabric 1/4" away from sewn line.

Fold out and press.

Block should measure 6 ½" x 3 ½".







Take your 6 1/2" patterned square and 4 of your basic 3 1/2" squares. In the same way as for your flying geese, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other then place on opposite corners of your larger square and sew along the diagonal line. press.

Repeat for the remaining corners. Press.



Take 4 of the 3 ½" light textured squares and 4 pink 2 ½"squares. using the same stitch and flip method as used for your flying geese, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other then place on one corner of your larger square and sew along the diagonal line. Press.











Sew your block together in rows. Press.










Make the following blocks and assemble in rows. Join rows together and press.





Layer your quilt top, wadding and backing and glue baste together. Quilt using your preferred method. Trim your quilt.

Sew your binding strips together end to end then add binding to your trimmed quilt to finish.



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
