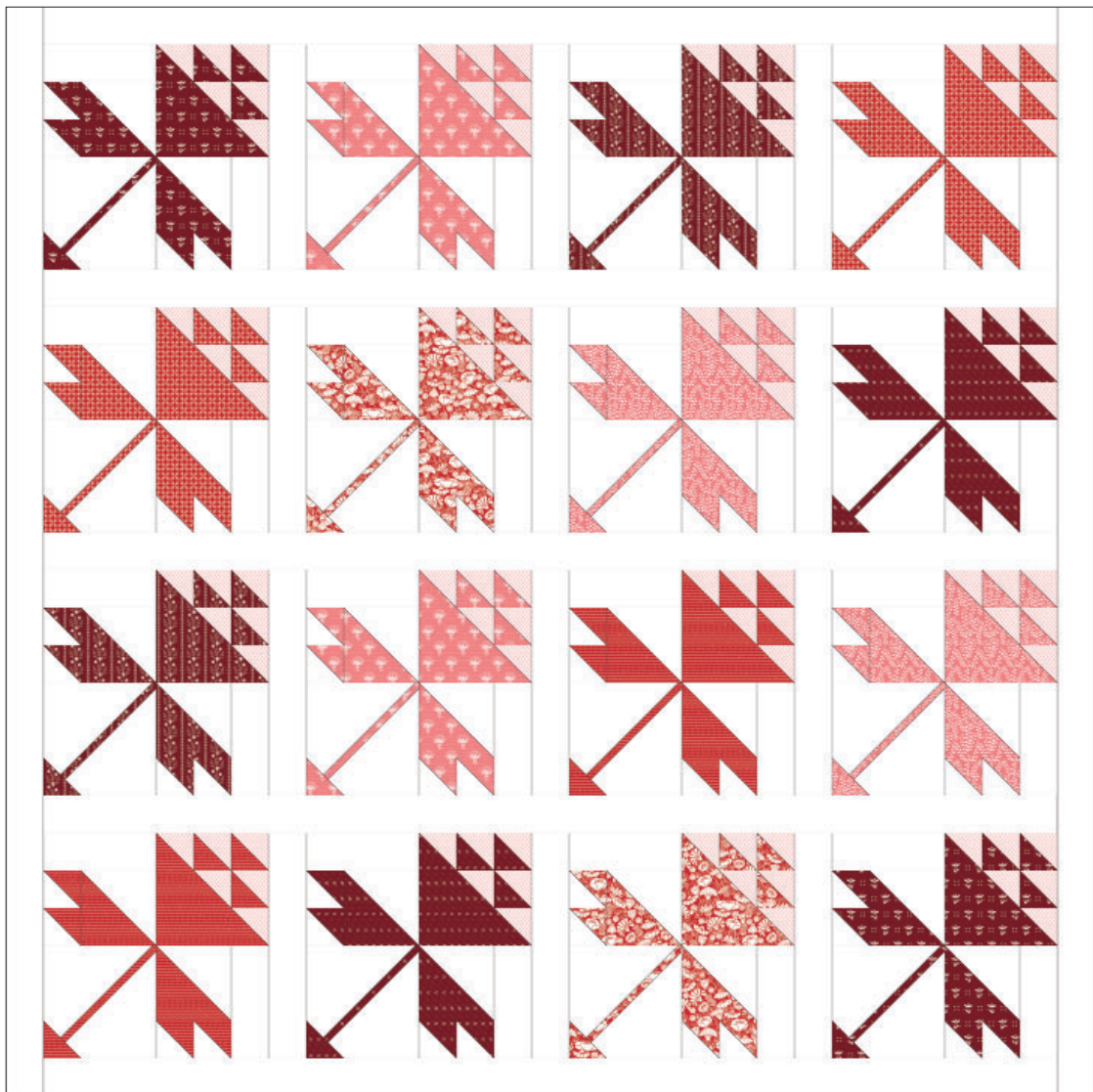

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

**English Ivy Quilt size:** 1.48m × 1.48m (58" × 58")

*Difficulty Rating: Moderate*

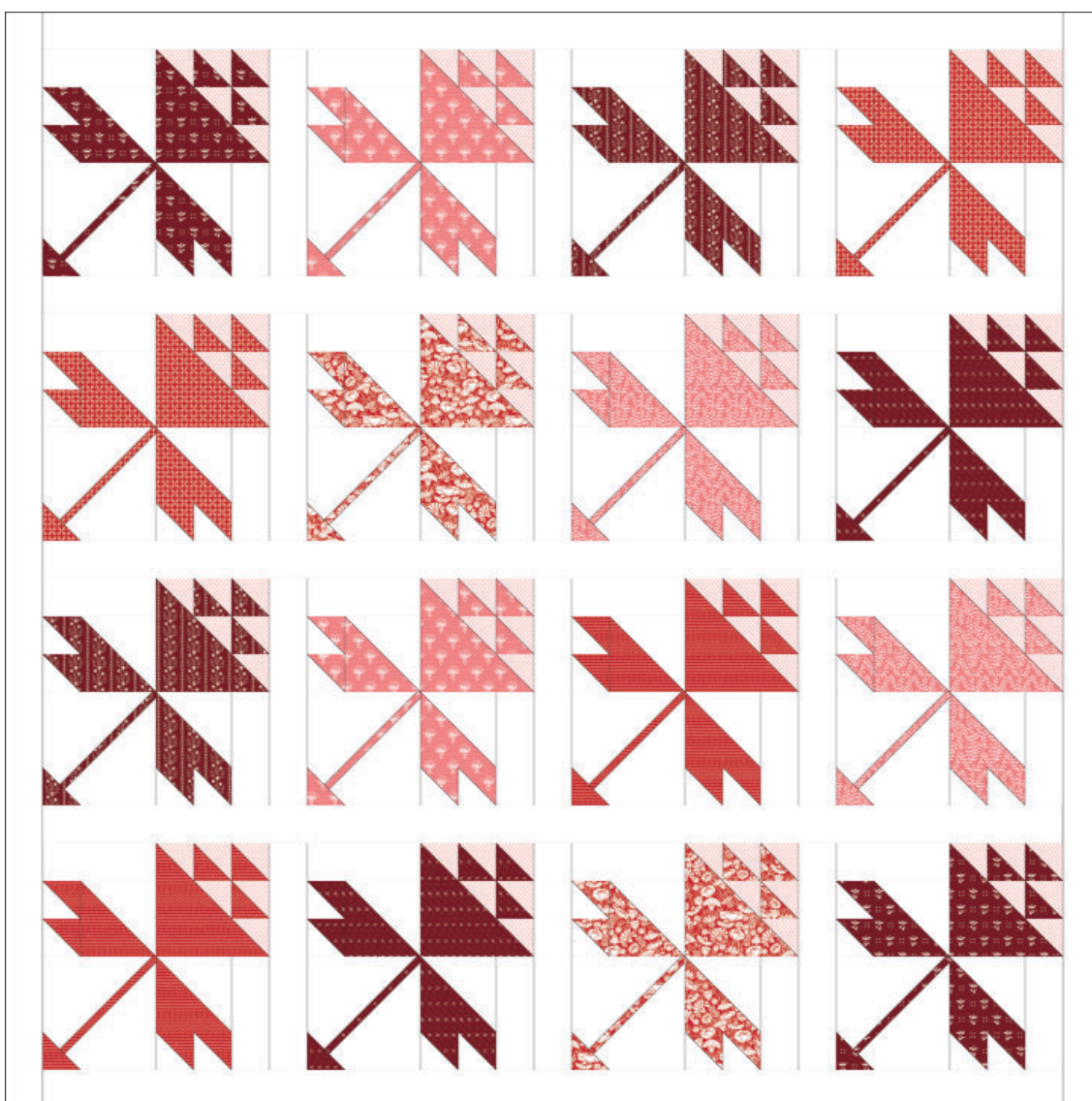
## GENERAL NOTES

- This sewing pattern is rated as moderate.
- Read through all the instructions before starting.
- Fabric quantities are based on a usable width of 42" (107 cm).
- Press fabrics before cutting.
- For machine-pieced or hand-pieced approach, the ¼" seam allowance is included in the template.
- Measurements are in inches.
- Use a ¼" seam allowance when assembling the quilt. Remember, accurate allowances are a must for an accurate result.
- When machine piecing, use a special ¼" patchwork foot to give you the correct seam allowance without the need to mark the fabric.
- Use a 50 wt cotton thread and a size 70 needle for machine sewing.
- Sew straight stitches with a slightly smaller than medium stitch.
- Remember to change the sewing machine needle after 8 hours of sewing.
- Press the seam allowance to one side, preferably toward the darker fabric. If it is not possible, the main goal is that the pressed seam should not be too bulky.










## QUILT LAYOUT

- The English Ivy Quilt is hand or machine pieced, and appliqué quilt (see **Figure 1**). The English Ivy block is a traditional quilt block.
- The English Ivy Quilt is made up of:
  - sixteen (16) English Ivy block,
  - twelve (12) Sashing A,
  - five (5) Sashing B, and
  - two (2) Borders.
- For fabric usage see the the Fabric Requirments on page 2, and the Cutting List on page 4.

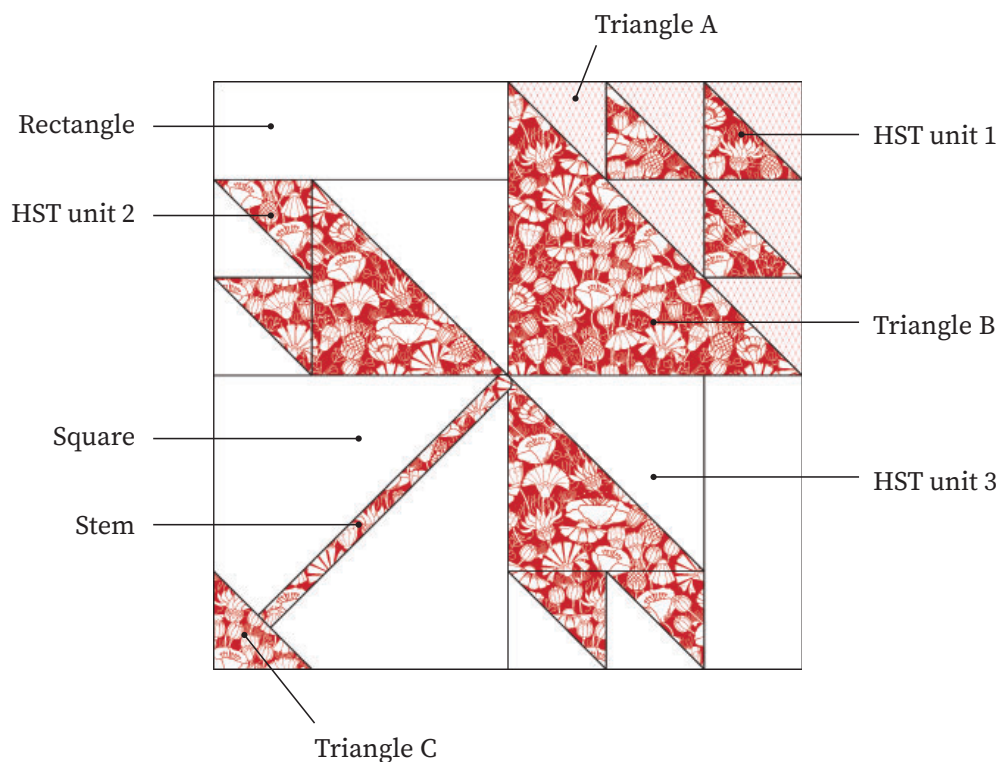

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. The English Ivy block is made up of (see **Figure 2**):
  - three (3) Half-square Triangle unit 1 (HST),
  - four (4) HST unit 2,
  - two (2) HST unit 3,
  - three (3) Triangle A,
  - one (1) Triangle B,
  - one (1) Triangle C,
  - one (1) Stem,
  - one (1) Square, and
  - two (2) Rectangles.

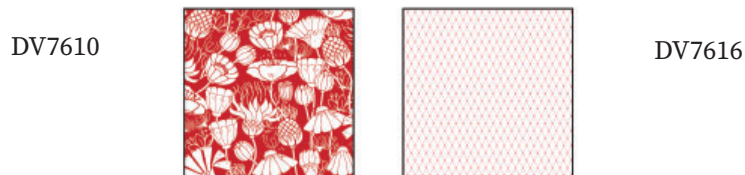

2. The English Ivy Quilt is built up of eight (8) pair of English Ivy blocks. The following instructions describe how you can sew two (2) identical English Ivy blocks.

3. First, make six (6) HST unit 1. To make two (2) of the required six (6) HST unit 1, place the following pieces of fabrics (see **Figure 3**):
- DV7610: three (3) 3" × 3" squares, and
  - DV7616: three (3) 3" × 3" squares.

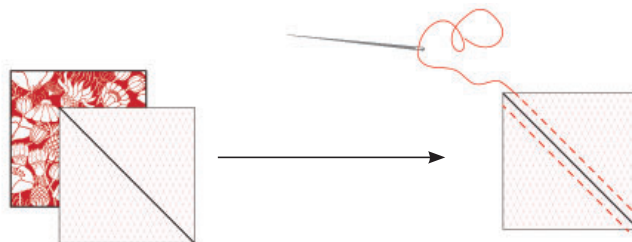
4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one (1) square (**Figure 4**).

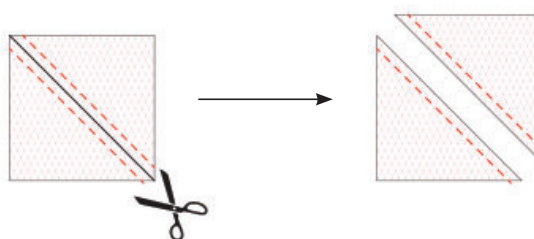
5. Place the fabric squares on each other, the right sides facing one another. Align their edges accurately and pin them in place. Sew 1/4" away from the drawn line on both sides (see **Figure 5**).

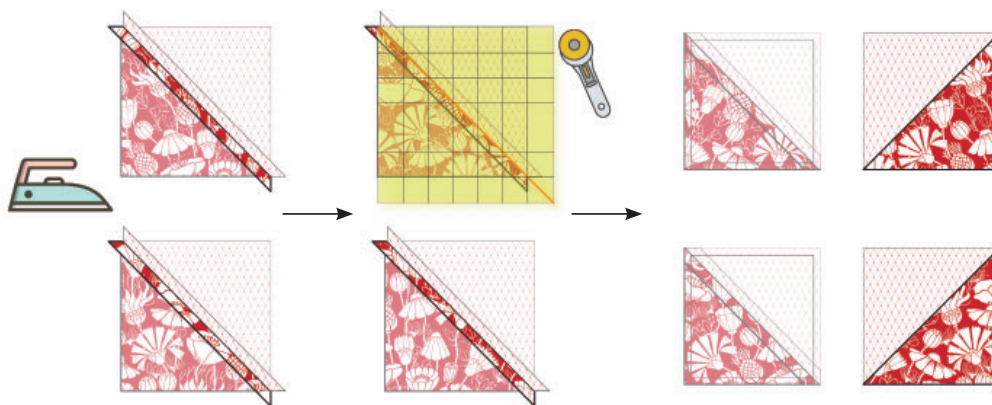
6. Cut along the drawn line to yield two (2) HST 1 units (see **Figure 6**).

7. Press open the seam of the HST unit 1. Use a quilting ruler to square up the HST unit 1. Use the diagonal seam as a guide. Trim the HST unit's raw edges (see **Figure 7**). The final HST unit 1 should be  $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$  ( $\frac{1}{4}''$  seam allowance included).

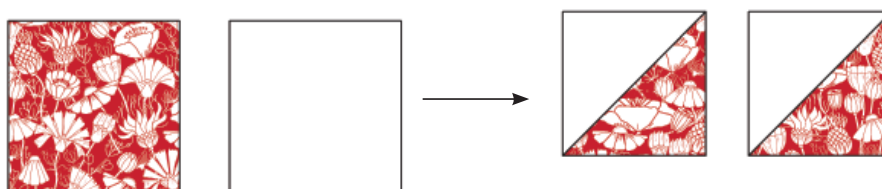
8. Repeat Step 3–7 on pages 6-7 to make four (4) more HST unit 1. The six (6) HST unit 1 can be distributed between two (2) English Ivy blocks.

9. Then, make eight (8) HST unit 2. To make two (2) HST unit 2 of the required eight (8) HST unit 2, place the following pieces of fabrics:

- DV7610: four (4)  $3'' \times 3''$  squares, and
- DV002 (white): four (4)  $3'' \times 3''$  squares.

10. Repeat Steps 4-7 on pages 6-7 to make six (6) more HST unit 2. The eight (8) HST unit 2 can be distributed between two (2) English Ivy blocks (see **Figure 8**).

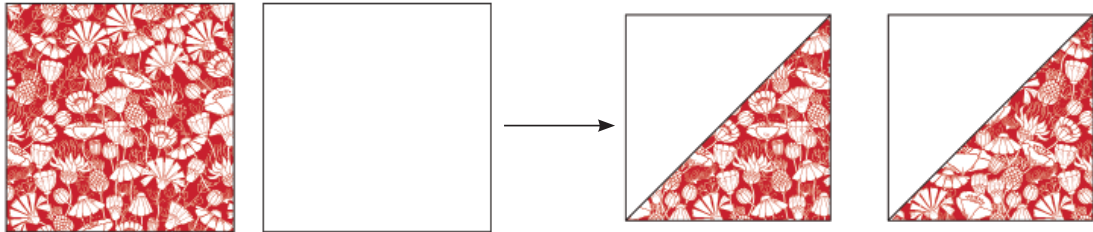


11. Then, make four (4) HST unit 3. To make two (2) HST unit 3 of the required four (4) HST unit 3, place the following pieces of fabrics:

- DV7610: two (2)  $5'' \times 5''$  squares, and
- DV002 (white): two (2)  $5'' \times 5''$  squares.

**12.** Repeat Steps 4-7 on page 6-7 to make two (2) more HST unit 3.  
The HST unit 3 size is  $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$  ( $\frac{1}{4}''$  seam allowance included). The four (4) HST unit 3 can be distributed between two (2) English Ivy blocks (see **Figure 9**).

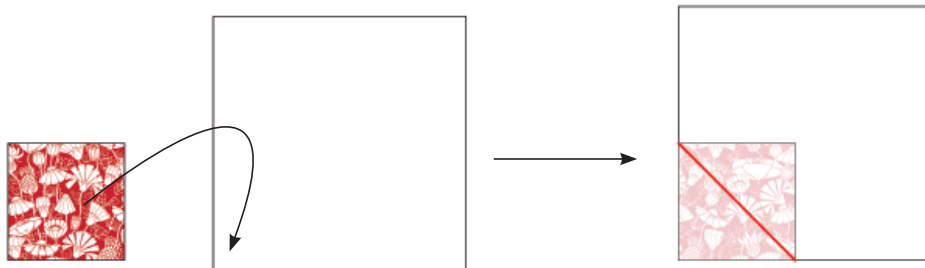
**13.** Place the following pieces of fabrics:

- DV7610: one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$  square, and
- DV002 (white): one (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$  square.

**14.** Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of  $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$  square.

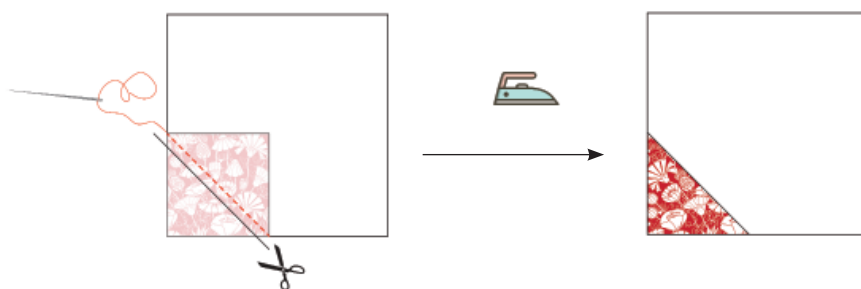
**Figure 10**

**15.** With the right sides together, place the one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$  square in the bottom left corner of the white  $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$  Square (see **Figure 10**).

**16.** Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Trim the outer corner, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}''$  seam allowance (see **Figure 11**). Press the seam allowance to the outer edge of the block.

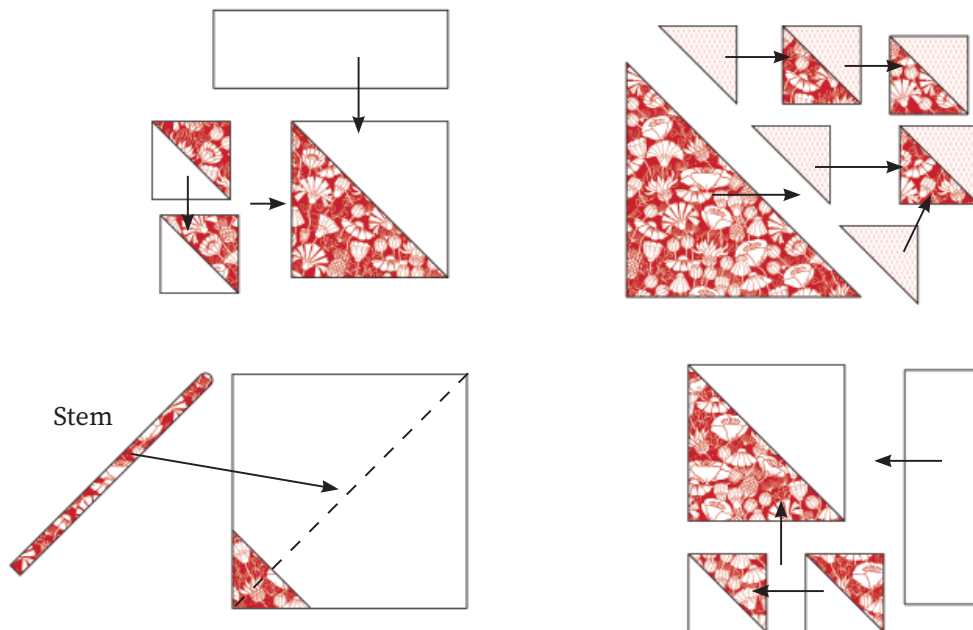
**TIP:** The corner cuts may be used for another project.

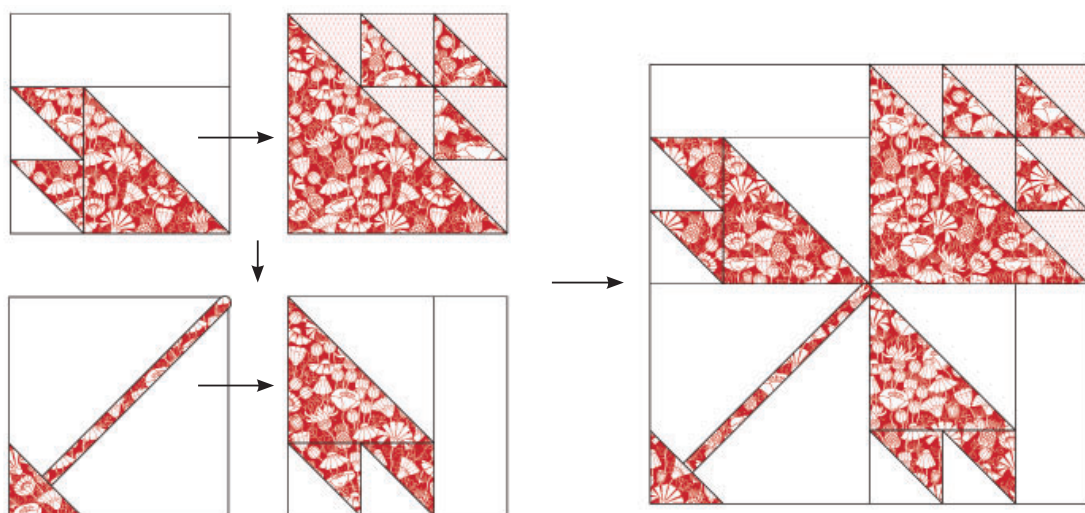
**17.** Assemble one (1) English Ivy block. Place the pieces of the block according to **Figure 12**. Sew the pieces together to make four (4) quadrants. Appliqué the Stem in place.

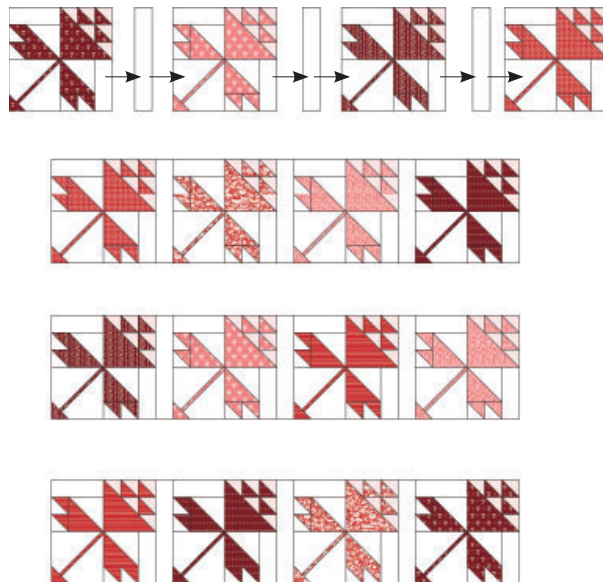
**Figure 13**

**18.** Sew the quadrants together according to **Figure 13**. The English Ivy block size is  $12\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$  ( $\frac{1}{4}''$  seam allowance included).

## ASSEMBLING THE QUILT

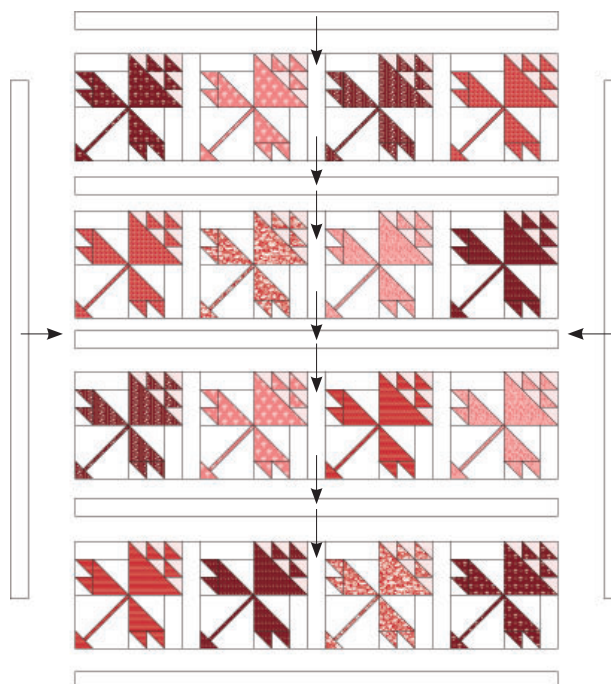
1. Lay out sixteen (16) English Ivy blocks and twelve (12) Sashing A rectangles in four (4) rows (see **Figure 12**). Sew the pieces together.

2. Lay out the previously sewn four (4) rows and five (5) Sashing B rectangles in nine (9) rows (see **Figure 13**). Sew the rows together. Then, join the Borders on the left and the right side. The quilt top is now finished.

## FINISHING THE QUILT

1. Cut out the appropriate size of the wadding, and the backing fabric. Layer the quilt top with the wadding and the backing. Centre the three layers. Make a quilt sandwich using curved safety pins or large stitches to tack (baste) a grid through the layers of the quilt in both directions, with lines about 2–3 inches apart. Hand or machine quilt as desired.
2. Sew the binding strips together end-to-end or use a 45-degree seam to create a long strip. Press the seams of the strip open. Press in half along the length, wrong sides together.
3. Place the binding strip onto the top of the quilt front so that all raw edges align on the outside edge of the quilt. Start sewing at the right-hand side of the quilt. Stop sewing  $\frac{1}{4}$ " before the corner, turn the quilt 45° clockwise, and continue the sewing toward the corner.
4. To make a mitred corner, take the quilt off the sewing machine. Fold the binding upwards, hold it in place, and then fold the binding down again. Reposition the binding to match the next quilt side. Continue sewing the binding from the top of the quilt toward the next corner.
5. Repeat step 4, making a mitred corner in the remaining three corners.
6. Join the two ends of the binding strip. Re-fold the binding toward the back of the quilt and secure it in place using clips. Sew the binding to the back of the quilt using slip stitches.
7. Your quilt is beautiful, so do not forget to sew your quilt label with your details on the back of the quilt. Your English Ivy Quilt is now finished. Be proud of yourself, as I am proud of you.
