Requirements List

Quilt Size: 178cm x 178cm (70" x 70")

- 75 cm Plain white, we used Devonstone Whitehaven
- Fat 1/8th of the Complete range of The Gooch Collection
- 1.9m border print either DV7821 or DV7820 stripe (Note, we used both border prints in our quilt so you can see which you prefer.)
- Backing and batting to suit 70" x 70" quilt

Skill Level: Intermediate

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Brundish Hall

Brundish Hall in Suffolk was the home of The Gooch Family, and we've designed a charming British Frame quilt to accompany our 'The Gooch Coverlet' collection.

These fabrics have been produced in conjunction with the Quilters' Guild of the British Isles. Machine pieced and with a small amount of simple hand applique, we know it will be a delight to stitch and enjoy for years to come.

You need to know how to needturn applique, mitre corner borders, rotary cutting , machine piecing

Quilt Size: 70" x 70" (178cm x 178cm)

Please read all instructions carefully before proceeding.

A 1/4" seam allowance is used throughout and is included in rotary cutting measurements.

Please add a 1/4" seam allowance to fabric when cutting applique shapes.

Cutting Instructions

From the 75cm of plain background cut

- 3 strips @ 3" x Width of Fabric (WoF). From this strip cut 30 @ 3" x 3" squares A.
- 10 strips @ 1 3/4" x WoF. From this strip cut 240 @ 1 3/4" x 1 3/4" squares B.
- From the 32 x Fat 1/8s cut the following for the centre block and spacer
 - From DV7824 pink stripe with stars cut 2 @ 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"
 - From DV7849 blue stripe cut 2 @ 7 1/4" x 7 1/4". These squares are cut oversize and will be trimmed to size after applique is complete.
 - From DV7822 border print cut 2 @ 1 1/2" x 13 1/2" and 2 @ 1 1/2" x 15 1/2".
 - Select four prints for the leaves and cut 2 from leaf template and 2 from leaf template reversed. Add 1/4" seam allowance when cutting in fabric.
 - Select one fabric and cut 1 @ circle template adding 1/4" seam allowance when cutting in fabric.

From the remainder of the fat 1/8s cut the following

- 30 @ 8" x 8" squares
- 120 @ 1 3/4" x 5 1/2" rectangle C , there are four rectangles per block and you will need to keep them in their fabric groups within each block.
- 120 @ 1 3/4" x 3" rectangle D, there are four rectangles per block and you will need to keep them in their fabric groups within each block.

From your chosen border print

- 1.9 metres, either DV7820 or DV7821, cut four lengthwise strips (parallel with selvedge) 4 @ 5 1/2" x length to allow for mitred corners. Cut these from the same section of fabric. The remainder can be used for binding.

Assembly

Centre applique block - Make 1

Block measures 13 1/2" x 13 1/2" including seam allowance

Stitch the four @ 7 1/4" x 7 1/4" squares together to make a four patch as shown.

Position the Leaf applique in each square and applique in place. You will reverse the template twice to achieve the lining up of the leaves with the adjacent leaves. Applique the circle to cover the ends of stems.

Trim the block to 13 1/2" x 13 1/2".



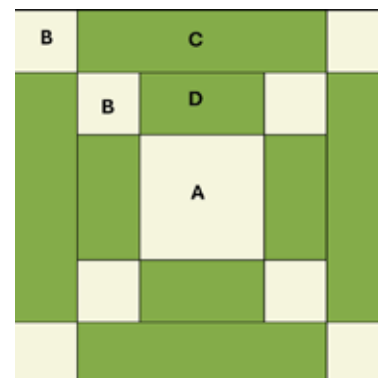
Lastly stitch the four spacers to the sides to bring the centre block to 15 1/2" x 15 1/2" incl. seam allowance.

Pieced counterpane blocks - Make 30

Block measures 8" x 8" including seam allowance

Stitch the blocks in the following sequence

- Sew two D rectangles to opposite sides of Centre A.
- Sew B squares to ends of remaining D rectangles and sew to opposite sides of A square.
- Sew two C rectangles to opposite sides of A,B,D square.
- Sew B squares to ends of remaining C rectangles and sew to opposite sides of A,B,D square to complete the block.

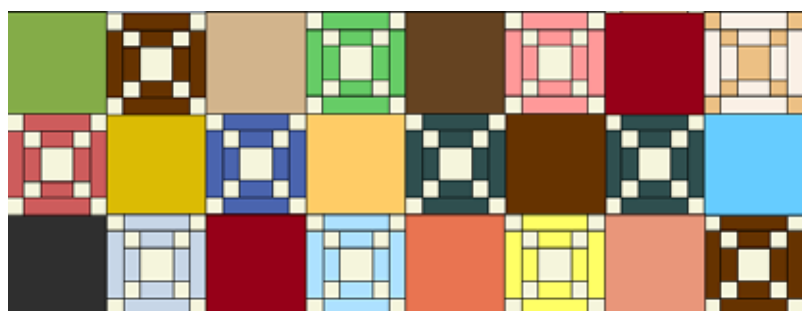


Assemble the blocks in rows

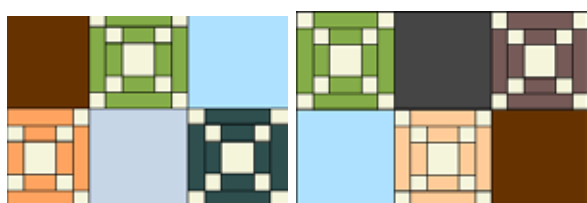
Stitch the 30 x 8" pieced blocks and the 30 x Counterpane blocks in rows to surround the centre block. Then sew to the centre block as shown below.



Make one for top row



Make one for bottom row



Make one each for either side of centre block



Quilt will measure 60 ½" x 60 ½" including seam allowance.

Sew mitred borders

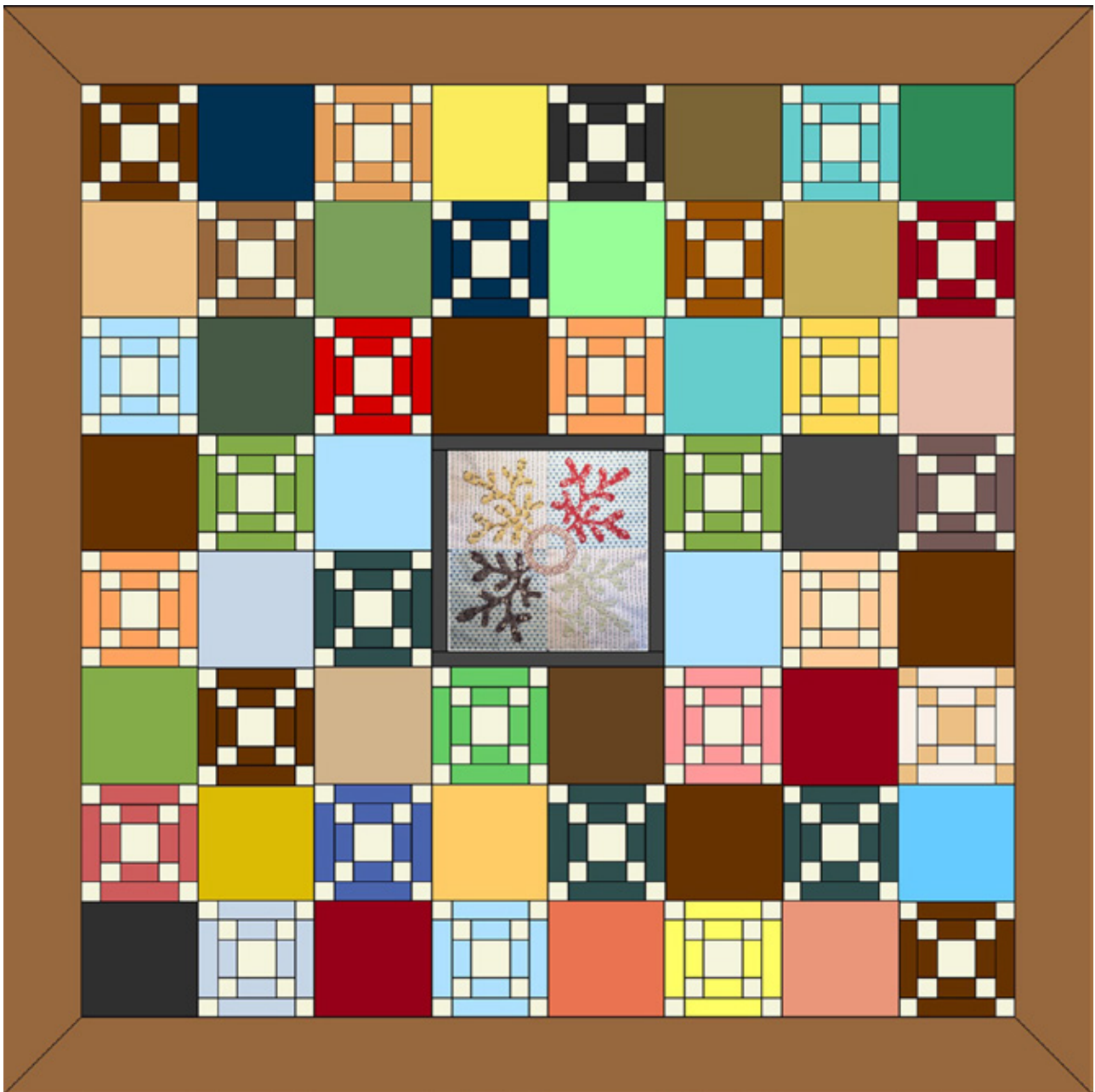
Taking your four border strips, mark the centre along the long side and then measure 30" in each direction to make a 60" finished inside measurement. Make sure you also mark in the 1/4" seam allowance. Mark a dot at this point and then mark in your 45 degree mitre stitching line.

Do this on all four border strips, do not cut mitres yet, we always do that last once we are sure the mitred corners sit flat.

Stitch all four mitred corners, then press and trim away the excess fabric.

This completes your quilt top.

Layer with batting and backing and quilt as desired. Once quilting is complete, bind with a double fold binding cut at 2 1/4" wide, you will have enough from the remainder of your 1.9 metre border piece.
