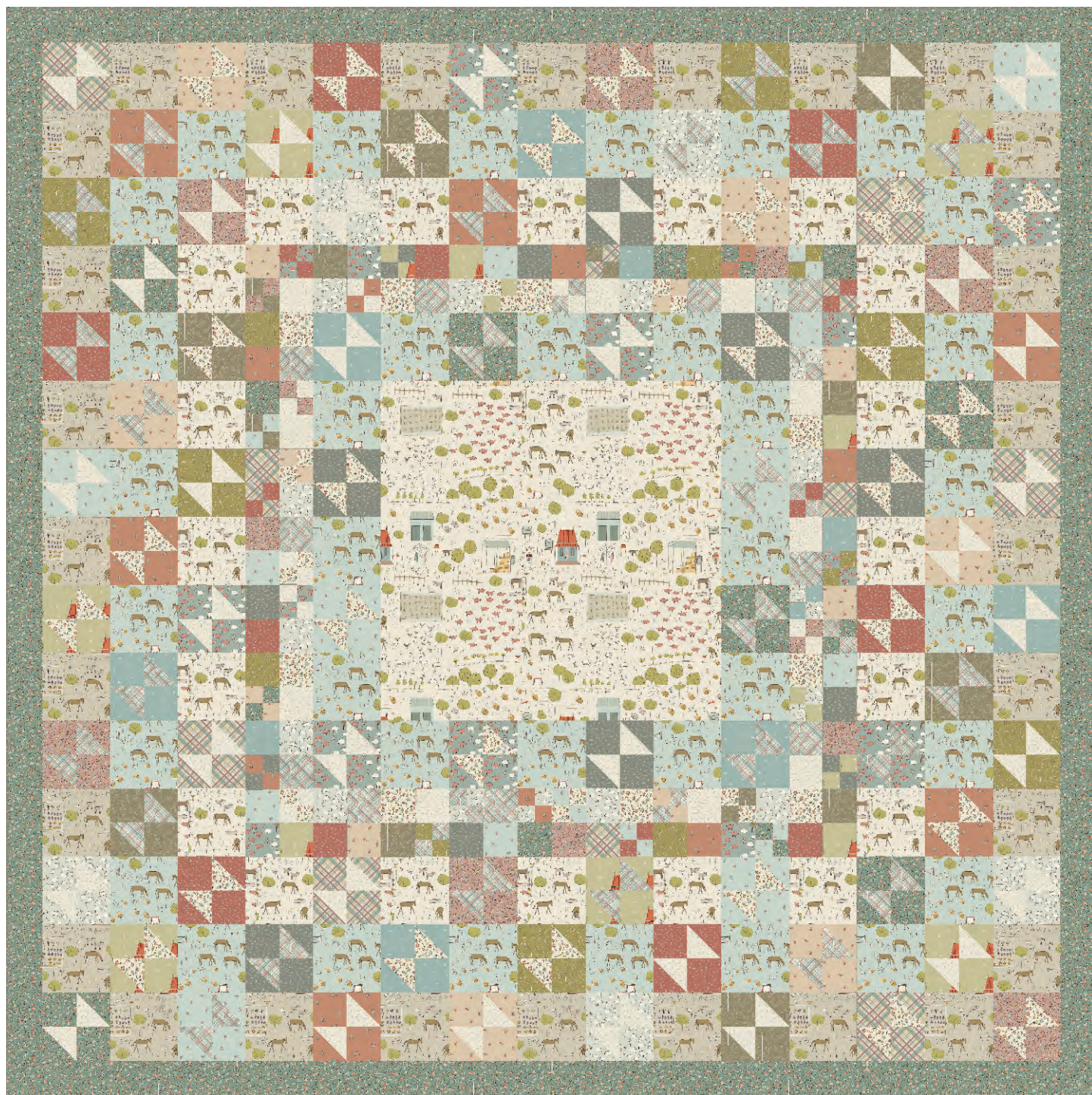
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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Cream panel (DV7730) - Centre block + border 4 - 28" (70cm)

Blue panel (DV7732) - Border 1 & 5 - 20" (50cm)

Beige panel (DV7731) - Border 6 - 20" (50cm)

14 assorted med-dark fabrics - Pieced blocks in borders 1, 4, 5 & 6, plus border 3 - fat quarter or 10" (25cm) of each

3 light fabrics - Pieced blocks in borders 1, 4, 5 & 6 plus border 2 - 16" (40cm)

Outer border - 20" (50cm)

Binding - 20" (50cm)

Backing and wadding - 72"x72" (1.8mx1.8m)



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Before you Begin

Use one quarter inch ($\frac{1}{4}$ ") seam allowances. Seam allowances are included in all cutting sizes given.

All measurements are based on fabric 42" (1.1m) wide.

Sew all fabric pieces with right sides together. Press all seams toward darker fabric and/or in the direction that creates the least bulk. Be sure to match seams.

Refer to diagrams for colour placement and block direction. Please note some fabric is directional.

Diagrams are numbered according to the numbered step (ie if you are on step 11, then the diagram is marked '11'). Read all instructions carefully.

You will need general sewing supplies such as scissors, pins, thread, sewing machine, rotary cutter, ruler and mat. I prefer to cut my fabric using a rotary cutter, mat and ruler to make cutting accurate.

Cutting Guide

Cream panel (centre block + border 4) - cut 1 of $20\frac{1}{2}$ "x $20\frac{1}{2}$ ",
20 of $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Blue panel (border 1 & 5) - cut 36 of $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Beige panel (border 6) - cut 28 of $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Pieced blocks (in borders 1, 4, 5 & 6) -

14 assorted med-dark fabrics - cut 6 of 3"x3"

+ 12 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " from each fabric

3 light fabrics - cut 31 of 3"x3" from each fabric

Border 2 -

Light-medium fabrics - cut a total of 40 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ",
and a total of 32 pairs of $1\frac{1}{2}$ "x $1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Dark fabrics - cut a total of 8 pairs of $1\frac{1}{2}$ "x $1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Border 3 -

Medium-dark fabrics - cut a total of 51 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ "
(4 of each of 13 fabrics), and 34 pairs of $1\frac{1}{2}$ "x $1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Outer Border - 7 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof

Binding - 7 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof

To Make

Pieced Triangle Blocks (for borders 1, 4, 5 & 6)

84 blocks need to be created.

To make one -

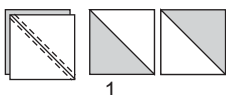
You will need -

1 of 3"x3" cream square

1 of 3"x3" medium/dark square

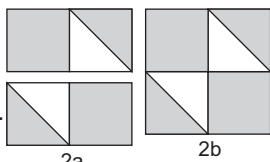
2 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " medium/dark square of same colour

1. Draw a line diagonally through a 3" light square. Place a 3" dark square under this. With right sides together, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " out from each side of the diagonal line. Cut along the diagonal line, then press the half square triangles open. Cut these back to measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

2. Position the two triangle blocks created in step 1, and the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares as shown in the diagram. Sew these together in pairs. Sew the pairs together to create a block measuring $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Repeat steps 1-2 to create 84 of the Pieced Triangle Blocks.

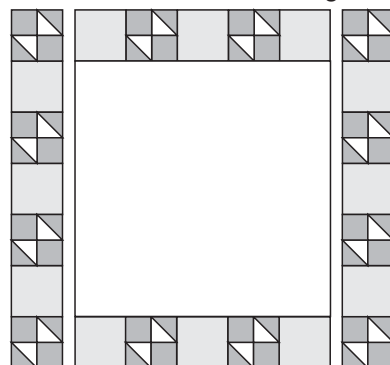
Border 1

3. Select 12 of the Pieced Triangle Blocks with a blue-tone background, and position them around the cream centre block, alternating them with 12 of the blue panel squares. Have the pieced triangle blocks featured in the corners.

4. Once happy with the configuration, sew five blocks together side-by-side using 3 blue panel squares and two pieced triangle blocks. This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $20\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew this to top of the cream centre block.

5. Repeat step 4 for the base of the cream centre block.

6. Sew seven blocks together one under the other using 4 pieced triangle blocks and 3 blue panel squares. This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $28\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat once and sew to each side of the cream centre block. Set aside.



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Border 2

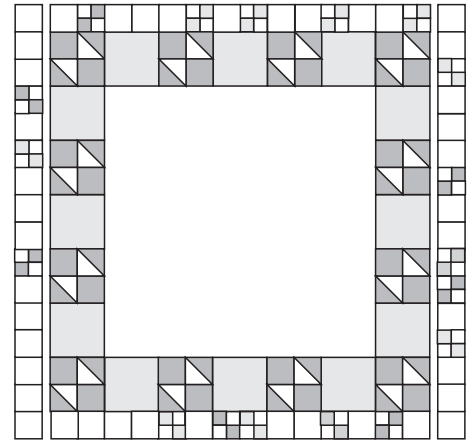
7. Select two pairs of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew one of each coloured square together. Repeat once, then sew these together, alternating the blocks, to form a 4-patch block measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Note - use only 1 dark pair with any light pair of squares for each 4-patch block.



Create 20 of 4-patch blocks.

8. Position the 20 of 4-patch blocks and 40 of light/medium $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares around the quilt top. Once happy with the configuration, sew 14 squares (ie a mixture of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4-patch blocks) together side by side. This should measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $28\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew this to the top of the quilt top.
9. Repeat step 8 and sew this to the base of the quilt top.
10. Sew 16 of the squares (ie a mixture of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4-patch blocks) together one on top of the other. This should measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $32\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat once then sew these units to each side of the quilt top.



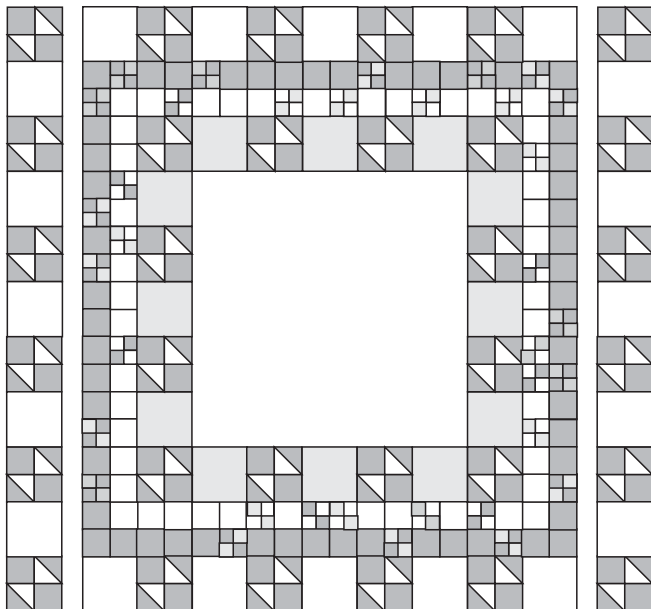
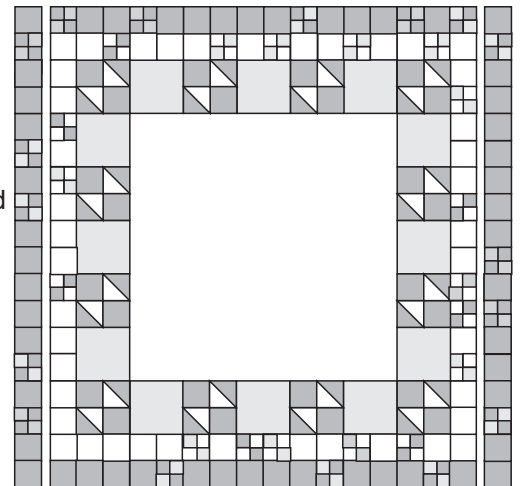
Border 3

11. Select two pairs of med/dark $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Sew one of each of the coloured squares together. Repeat once, then sew these together, alternating the blocks, to form a 4-patch block measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Create 17 of 4-patch blocks.

12. Position the 17 of 4-patch blocks and 51 of medium/dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares around the quilt top. Once happy with the configuration, sew 16 squares (ie a mixture of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4-patch blocks) together side by side. This should measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $32\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew this to the top of the quilt top.
13. Repeat step 12 and sew this to the base of the quilt top.
14. Sew 18 of the squares (ie a mixture of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4-patch blocks) together one on top of the other. This should measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $36\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat once then sew these units to each side of the quilt top.



Border 4

15. Position 20 of the assorted Pieced Triangle Blocks and 20 of the cream panel $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares around the quilt top, alternating them with one another.

Have the pieced triangle blocks featured in the corners.

16. Once happy with the configuration, sew 9 blocks together side-by-side using 5 cream panel squares and 4 pieced triangle blocks.

This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $36\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew this to top of the quilt top.

17. Repeat step 16 for the base of the quilt top.

18. Sew 11 blocks together one under the other using 6 pieced triangle blocks and 5 cream panel squares.

This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $44\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat once and sew to each side of the quilt top.



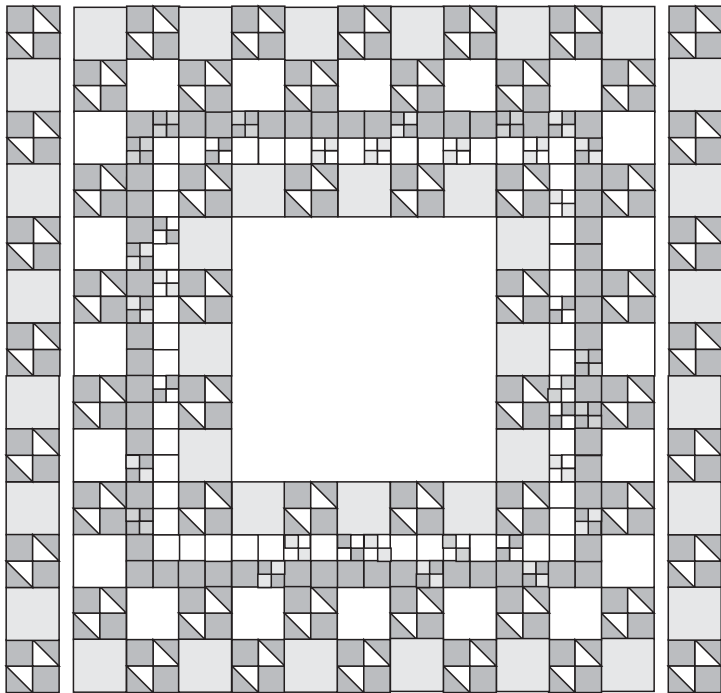
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Border 5

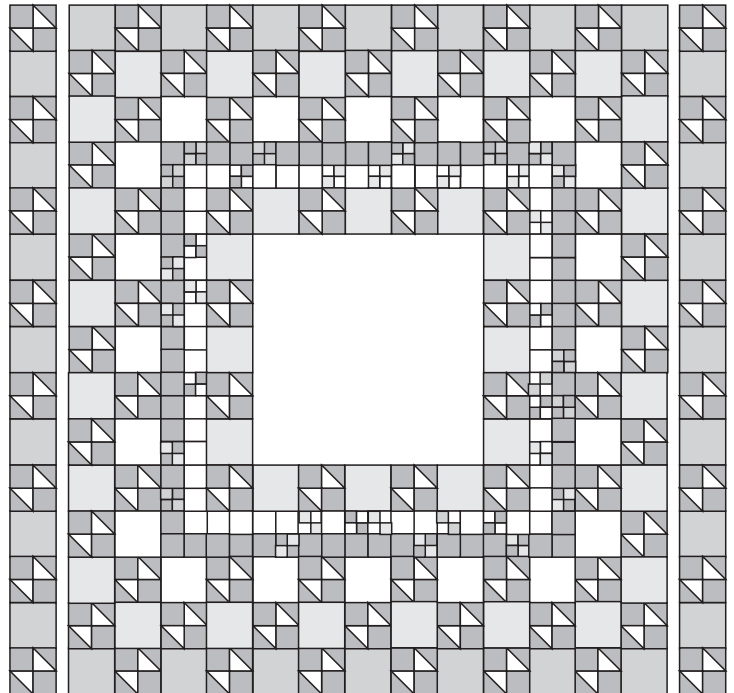
19. Position 24 of the assorted Pieced Triangle Blocks and 24 of the blue panel $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares around the quilt top, alternating them with one another.
Have the pieced triangle blocks featured in the corners.
20. Once happy with the configuration, sew 11 blocks together side-by-side using 6 blue panel squares and 5 pieced triangle blocks. This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $44\frac{1}{2}$ ".
Sew this to top of the quilt top.
21. Repeat step 20 for the base of the quilt top.



22. Sew 13 blocks together one under the other using 7 pieced triangle blocks and 6 blue panel squares.
This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $52\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat once and sew to each side of the quilt top.

Border 6

23. Position 28 of the assorted Pieced Triangle Blocks and 28 of the beige panel $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares around the quilt top, alternating them with one another.
Have the pieced triangle blocks featured in the corners.
24. Once happy with the configuration, sew 13 blocks together side-by-side using 7 beige panel squares and 6 pieced triangle blocks. This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $52\frac{1}{2}$ ".
Sew this to top of the quilt top.
25. Repeat step 24, and sew this to the base of the quilt top.
26. Sew 15 blocks together one under the other using 8 pieced triangle blocks and 7 beige panel squares.
This should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $60\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat once and sew to each side of the quilt top.



Outer Border

27. Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide outer border strips together end-to-end.
28. Crosscut to yield two lengths of $60\frac{1}{2}$ ", and two lengths of $64\frac{1}{2}$ ".
29. Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $60\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths to the top and base of the quilt top.
30. Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $64\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths to each side of the quilt top.

Your quilt top is now complete!!

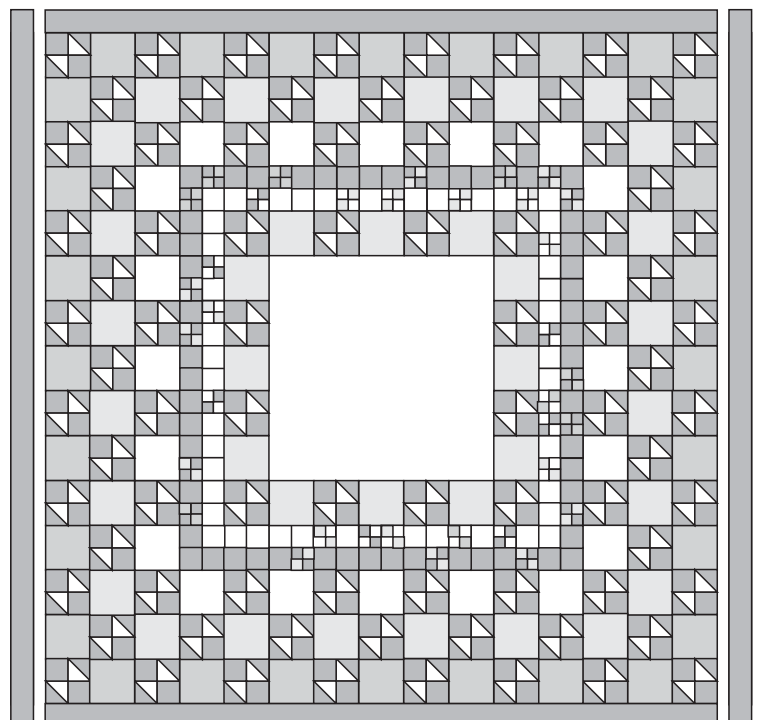
Quilt and bind your quilt. I had mine professionally quilted.
